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#### ENTERING THE LABOUR MARKET - WHAT ARE THE CHALLENGES?





Partners in the Back2Basics project plan to develop a "Guide on Online Communication and Etiquette" to help graduates develop a more professional image of themselves before the employers and within the labour market, thus facilitating their integration in this environment.

As a starting point, Associação BioLiving and GRI developed two **Focus Groups** each, with companies and recent graduates to identify real-life experience and knowledge of what is lacking in the labour market from both perspectives.

The conclusions drawn from both countries are interestingly similar. The findings suggest that, in general, recent graduates are not well-prepared for the real job market and lack the necessary skills and employability profiles required.

Some suggestions were made in order to increase possibilities of being hired include attending specific training courses, taking initiative to solve problems, doing internships, participating in brainstorming sessions or engaging in online forums to be more aware of political and social issues.
















# DIGITAL SKILLS FOR BETTER EMPLOYABILITY

today's rapidly evolving ln marketplace, where technological development is driving emergence of new work scenarios that require new and updated skills, digital skills have become requirement essential for employability. However, there is a growing gap between the demand for digital skills and the number of workers who possess them, meaning that individuals who demonstrate proficiency in the digital skills' different dimensions are at a clear advantage in the labour market.



The "Back2Basics - Digital Skills for better employment" training course was developed taking into account not only the training needs perceived by young students but also the gaps identified by institutions and organisations when hiring new employees. In order to train more digitally prepared graduates and young people, the training course covers themes, such as information and data literacy, citizenship through digital technologies, digital identity and netiquette, health and well-being in digital settings, cyber hygiene and online personal protection.















# FIRST BACK2BASICS TRAINING COURSE IN GREECE



The first training course, held in Thessaloniki from 20th to 24th February 2023, brought together 22 young participants from various countries – Portugal, Spain, Greece – and it was a unique opportunity to share and learn about what it means to be an aware and qualified citizen in this digital age, as well as an unforgettable moment of crosscultural sharing and learning. Besides the learning activities, which included a session with Delloite and Human Value Guest Speakers, participants also had the chance to learn more about Greece and the Greek culture, an unforgettable intercultural experience for everyone!
